Kodály Teaching

The Kodály concept of music education continues to attract great attention around the world, primarily because of its ability to offer children stimulating and enjoyable music lessons while at the same time helping them become musically literate and develop an appreciation for fine music.



The Kodály concept is an approach to music education inspired by the Hungarian composer and educator, Zoltan Kodály (1882-1967). Its primary goal is to cultivate a love and appreciation for music that is supported by understanding and direct musical experience.

The Kodály Approach can be applied to the musical training of all age groups; from infant to adult. The approach stresses active learning through a variety of musical activities including performing, listening, moving and creating music. Yet the most distinguishable feature of Kodály teaching is the emphasis on learning through singing.

Kodály believed that singing should be the foundation of all music education. "It is a long accepted truth," wrote Kodály, "that singing provides the best start to music education; even the most talented artist can never overcome the disadvantages of an education without singing." The use of the singing voice gives a student direct access to music without the technical constraints associated with an instrument. Moreover, it leads to a deep internalisation of musical skills.

Music literacy remains a key component of the approach and is developed sequentially using a developmental approach. True musical literacy is much more than knowing letter names. Kodály envisaged a deep literacy in which a child would have the same facility with musical notation as with text. Music literacy is always connected with the development of strong aural skills.

About the Courses

The course is accredited by the KMEIA national body and participants who complete and pass the course will be eligible to apply for credit for some subjects in level one of the *Australian Kodály Certificate in Music Education*.

What do these courses offer?

Methodology involves the application of Kodaly's principles to the development of classroom teaching programmes that are suitable for Australian children. It includes the study of:

- *Kodaly philosophy – basic tenets and pedagogical application*
- *Curriculum development*
- *Teaching techniques*
- *Sequencing learning*
- *Lesson planning and assessment*

Entry Requirements

The courses are suited to primary school specialist class music teachers. It is expected that applicants for the course should have (or be completing) a degree/diploma or equivalent in music education and/or education. If the applicant has none of the above, they will be interviewed and offered the opportunity to demonstrate their suitability. This would include basic musical knowledge and music literacy skills.

The course is effectively an in-service training program, and learners are encouraged to apply their developing skills in the workplace. Emphasis is placed upon lower primary (Level 1), middle primary (Level 2) and upper primary (Level 3). Level 3 Course is offered to Level 2 graduates.
